EDT 608 Challenge Exam

This Challenge Exam takes two hours and has a non-refundable fee of \$50.00. It is based on the information in the textbook: Integrating Technology for Meaningful Learning, by Grabe and Grabe.

The test may be taken only once, under supervision at one of our learning centers. It is closed book, and there is no study guide. The exam consists of a three part assignment based on the course content. In carrying out each assignment, show your expertise and knowledge in using educational technology. The assignments are straight-forward and were designed to allow you to show your mastery of technology. A score of 80% or better qualifies as a successful completion of the Challenge Exam. The test will be sent to the Lead Faculty in San Diego to be graded, and the score will be given to the Dean's assistant to be entered into the mainframe the same day that it is graded. Please allow at least two weeks after taking the test for it to be graded and entered into the mainframe. Successfully passing this Challenge Exam will waive the tier I clear credential requirements for the State of California. Please save your MS Word document on the 3.5 inch disk and turn in the disk, **along with a hard copy of your work**, upon completion of your work.

EDT 655 Challenge Exam

This Challenge Exam takes three hours and has a non-refundable fee of \$50.00. It is based on the information in the textbook: Edutopia, by Milton Chen, Executive Editor and Sara Armstrong, Editor, information from the California Technology Assistance Project (CTAP) at <http://ctap2.iassessment.org>, and your own acquired information on the trends in educational technology. You will need to be familiar with the CTAP web site noted above so insure that you have gone on-line and established a CTAP account before taking the exam.

The test may be taken only once, under supervision at one of our learning centers. It is closed book, and there is no study guide for the exam, which consists of a three part assignment based on the course content. This Challenge Exam is available for students to take in order to clear Tier II of their state requirements in technology. The exam is in three parts that address issue and trends in technology (i.e. what skills and forms of communication students will need in the next century). Part 1 is a multi-part question; Part 2 is a PowerPoint slide show involving CTAP Levels/Assessments, and Part 3 is a comparison essay on case studies from the Edutopia text. In addition to printing your work as directed, please save your MS Word and Power Point documents on the 3.5 inch disk and turn in the disk, **along with a hard copy of your work**, upon completion of your work.
